E) HORSES

Stabling arrangements

from 25/06/2008 to 29/06/2008 to be paid by the OC.

Straw bedding will be provided free of charge. Horses will get Havens horse feed free of charge. Additional feed is obtainable at prices of the day on the show grounds. Bedding with shavings (at additional charge of 12,-€ by the OC) and special requests regarding stabling must be made by the closing date of the definite entry. The disposal of straw is free of charge. For the disposal of shavings a fee of 16 € per box will be charged.

Settlement of charges for shavings and the disposal of shavings together with the general settlement of accounts (see § 14).

Feed will be delivered from Wednesday, June 25th until Sunday, June 29th, 2008.

The following stable security regulations must be obeyed:

- Smoking is strictly prohibited in the entire stable area.
- Open fires (e.g. camping stoves) are strictly prohibited.
- Only the actually needed amount of feed supplies may be stored in the stables.
- Open space and entry ways between the stables may not be obstructed by trucks or lorries

Those who disregard the above security regulations will be reprimanded by the OC accordingly.

The competitors are authorised to carry the logo of their personal sponsor on the saddle cloth in accordance with Art. 136.1-2. The Chief Steward will check that the advertising and publicity on competitors and horses complies with Article 136 of the General Regulations.

The forwarding agency will inform about all necessary conditions of importation. The OC will cover the costs of any customs clearance in accordance with GR Art. 132.1.

All customs documents (T-1 documents) are to be submitted at the latest by the first day of competition to the entry office.

2. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ENTRY OF HORSES

Every competitor is supplied to deliver all necessary certificates of health for the transport to the event or identification of the horses before they come into the stables:

- a) in case of arrival from a EU-member-country, a certificate for registered horses acc. to sample of Annex B to Reglements 90/426 of the actual valid form (sample is enclosed to schedule) will be necessary.
- b) in case of arrival from a country not concerning to the EU, a certificate of health for registered horses acc. to sample of annex II of the decision of the commission 92/260 of the actual valid form will be necessary.

A certificate must be done in at least one official language of the country of destination and in one official language of the member country. The competitor must carry with him the original certificate, not a copy.

The organiser sees to it that on the competition site, an official state veterinarian is present to issue the health certificates which are necessary for the transport of the horses to their destination abroad.

In case the OC has entrusted to a forwarding agency, the latter is ready to assist regarding the required documents.

Furthermore, questions relating to health requirements for horses can be directed to the veterinary authorities in the country of origin or in Germany.

VETERINARY REGULATIONS, 10th Edition, effective 1st June 2006

VETERINARY EXAMINATIONS, HORSE INSPECTIONS & PASSPORT CONTROLS

These will be carried out in accordance with the "Veterinary Regulations", Art. 1011 & the discipline rules.

"General Regulations", 22nd Edition, effective 1st June 2007:

Art. 139.1

Every horse entered for any competition at CNs or CIMs (see Appendix D) in a foreign country (see GRs 141.2), and all horses entered for other CIs, CIOs, Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, whether at home or in foreign countries (see GRs 141.2), must have an official, valid FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI and accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card and, when applicable, an FEI registration number, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

Art. 139.2

Horses taking part in CNs and CIMs (see Appendix D) in their country of residence are not required to have such a passport as is mentioned in paragraph 1. All such horses must be properly registered and identifiable and, unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION, VET. REGS. ANNEX VII

(except events taking place in NZL & AUS)

All horses and ponies for which an FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI has been issued, must have the vaccination section endorsed by a veterinarian, stating that it has received two injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza, given between 1 and 3 months apart. In addition, a booster injection must be recorded as

having been given within each succeeding 6 months, subsequent to the second injection of the primary vaccination. None of these injections must have been given within the preceding 7 days including the day of the competition or of entry into the competition stables.

The above are the minimum requirements for influenza vaccination. Both primary and first and subsequent booster injections should be given according to the manufacturer's instructions which will fall within the stipulation of the FEI ruling.

SAMPLING FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES

(Vet. Regs. Chapter V & VI and Annex IV)

Regular sampling is carried out in CC13*/4*, CSIs (3*, 4*, 5*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CIs sampling is recommended. When testing takes place, the number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate; however, a minimum of three is recommended (Vet. Regs. Art. 1016)

Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme (Groups I & II only).

MEDICATION CONTROL PROGRAMME (GROUP I & II ONLY)

The Organising Committees of FEI events within Groups I & II are advised to charge competitors the equivalent of CHF 12.50 per horse per event as a contribution towards the costs of the MCP programme.

MEDICATION CONTROL LABORATORY

Under the Medical Control Programme (MCP) in Groups I and II, all samples collected in accordance with VR Art. 1017.1 will be analysed by Laboratoire Courses Hippiques, 15 rue de Paradis, 91370 Verrières le Buisson, France, Tel.: +33.1 - 69 75 28 28, Fax: +33.1 - 69 75 28 29.

IX. MISCELLANEOUS

1. PROTESTS (*Art. 167*)

Each protest must be made and signed by the Chef d'Equipe or persons responsible and be forwarded within the time prescribed. All protests to be valid must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150.- or equivalent.

2. PRIZE-GIVING CEREMONY

The participation in the prize-giving ceremony and the lap of honour is obligatory for all placed competitors.

3. DISTRIBUTION OF PRIZES AND INDEMNITIES

All prize money and all prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money as well as reimbursements will be distributed acc. to FEI-RG Art. 130.2 following the last competition. The scheduled prizes are gross amounts.

The total amount of prize money shown for each competition in the schedule must be distributed

Per competition all competitors receive prize-money or prizes in kind instead of prize-money.

Settlement of accounts per competitor

Reimbursement of prize-money will be paid out **by bank transfer** per competitor (not per horse resp. per horse owner) within 14 days after the CHIO. For this purpose the NF's are requested to state the bank information (**name of recipient, bank name, bank code, account number, IBAN and BIC codes**) of their competitors together with the online entries. In case the money transaction does not go through due to incorrect or incomplete bank information, the OC reserves the right to charge a lump sum of 80,-€ for any handling fees charged by the bank.

The Organising Committee is authorised to deduct any possible outstanding duties from the payment. Each competitor is obliged to forward the prize-money to the respective horse owner.

Each competitor is requested to check and sign the final account at the accounting office before departure.

Taxation of Foreign Horse Owners, Competitors and Grooms:

According to § 50a - Abs. 4 EStG of the German Tax Rights the OC must detain tax (withholding tax on income earned) from all accounts paid out to foreign horse owners, competitors and grooms. Therefore, the total amount of tax payable will be deducted from prize-money, reimbursement of transport, travelling, hotel, feed and bedding charges by the administration office at the settlement of accounts.

The horse owners and competitors can apply for exemption of these taxes at the Central Federal Office for Finances, if the lawful requirements are met: Bundeszentralamt für Steuern, Platanenweg 33, 53225 Bonn, Germany, phone: (49) 228-4060, fax: (49) 228-4062661. An exemption of these taxes is only possible if the appropriate certificate is submitted. The documents for the exemption of tax can be downloaded from the website www.bzst.bund.de. Subject to change.

6. INSURANCES

All Chefs d'Equipe, competitors, owners, trainers, team veterinarians and their accompaniments are personally responsible for damages to third persons caused by themselves, their employees/grooms, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out a third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date. The OC will **NOT** be responsible for any damage caused by competitors, their horses, owners, NF officials, their employees/grooms or their representatives.

7. LIABILITY

The OC declines any liability for property or pecuniary damage which may happen to visitors, competitors, grooms and horse owners through slight negligence of the OC, his delegates or his assistants. The OC also declines any liability for theft, fire or other incidents.

By making the definite entries each competitor declares that he/she has taken notice of the schedule and the exclusion of the liability as set out in the schedule and that the competitor explicitly agrees therewith.

8. EVENT'S ORGANISATION (Art. 114 - 115)

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of the Delegate of the NF GER, *the Chefs d'Equipe* and Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matter or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all competitors and officials as soon as possible and must be reported to the FEI Vaulting Department by the Foreign Judge.

9. ENTRY RIGHT TO SHOWGROUNDS (Art. 133, 1005)

Accreditation / Show Passes Vaulting

Show passes can only be picked up personally after presentation of a valid ID-card.

The passes must be worn at all times on the show grounds.

The passes will be withdrawn if they are passed on.

Entrance passes to the stable area are according to VR Art. 1005.2.5.

At least one of the names of the owners must correspond with the horse owners registered in the FEI passport of the horse (GR Art. 133.1).

10. HORSE LORRIES

Horse lorries (max. one caravan or trailer per competitor) can be parked on or near the show grounds for the duration of the respective discipline, provided the OC has received a request prior to the closing date of the definite entry. Only the assigned place may be used without fail. Electricity is supplied through installations at the assigned place. Cable is to be supplied by the owner of the lorry.

Competitors, whose horses leave the show grounds without special permission of the OC during the CHIO - after the first horse inspection until one half hour after the announcement of the results of the last competition - will be disqualified.

11. ILLUSTRATIONS

The OC reserves the right to make use of illustrations (photographs, images, videos, etc.) made on behalf of the OC during the event or on the show grounds for their own commercial purposes, without explicit consent of the person/competitor illustrated.

12. NO MOTORISED CARRIAGES, MOTORBIKES, BICYCLES

are allowed on the entire show grounds and the cross-country course.

13. NO DOGS ALLOWED

Dogs are strictly prohibited on the entire show grounds, the stables and the cross-country course.

- 14.** As soon as NFs have presented their entries, all Chefs d'Equipe, competitors, also on behalf of the horse owners, as well as their employees/grooms, representatives and accompaniments are obliged, from the moment of arrival on the show grounds, to acknowledge and keep within the rules of the official show schedule, to acknowledge and keep within the German Animal and Welfare Laws and Guidelines, and to behave according to the ethical principles in common practice. Violations will be dealt with by the respective Ground Jury or Appeal Committee. This is to be confirmed in writing upon receipt of the show pass.

As soon as NFs have presented their entries, all Chefs d'Equipe, competitors, also on behalf of the horse owners, as well as their employees/grooms, representatives and accompaniments, are obliged, from the moment of arrival on the show grounds, to acknowledge and keep within the "Code of Conduct". Violation of this code will be dealt with by the respective Ground Jury or Appeal Committee, in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the FEI.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.

4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
