IV. TYPES OF COMPETITIONS FEI J-EU-CH-V and FEI W-CH-V:

1. The FEI Junior Open European Vaulting Championship in Brno is organised for Junior individuals (male & female) and teams 1*.

2. The FEI World Vaulting Championship in Brno is organised for Senior individuals (male & female) and teams 2*.

IV./1. The FEI Junior Open European Vaulting Championship

1.1. TEAM Vaulting Competitions for teams 1* (Art.715; 731 - 743)

16 years and younger

A vaulting **junior team** is composed of one longeur, one horse, six vaulters, and may include one alternate vaulter. (Art.731;732;734;741)

The competition will be held over three tests in two rounds. The first round consists of compulsory and free test. The final (second) round consists of only free test. Final score see Art.742

The best 12 junior teams of the first round are allowed to start in the final (second) round. In case there are junior teams not only from Europe, but outside of Europe in the best 12 placed teams, than in the second round more than 12 junior teams may start. The final number of the starting teams depends on the number of non European junior teams in the best 12 placed.

1.2. Female Individual Vaulting Competition for Juniors (Art .715;744;745; 746; 747)

Female junior individual: 14 – 18 years

The competition consists of two rounds of four tests, in both round compulsory and free test must be performed. In the first round the total marks from the Compulsory Test and the Free

Test are added and divided by 2. In the second round the total marks from the compulsory test and the second Free Test are added and divided by 2. The final mark is the average of the 2 rounds. All results will be rounded off to the third decimal (i.e. 0.0011-0.0015 down; 0.0016-0.0019 up).

In case of equality, the higher mark from the Compulsory Test from the first round will decide.

The best 15 placed vaulters of the first round may start in second round.

1.3. Male Individual Vaulting Competition for Juniors (Art .715;744;745; 746; 747)

Male junior individual: 14 – 18 years

The competition consists of two rounds of four tests, in both round compulsory and free test must be performed. In the first round the total marks from the Compulsory Test and the Free Test are added and divided by 2. In the second round the total marks from the compulsory test and the second Free Test are added and divided by 2. The final mark is the average of the 2 rounds. All results will be rounded off to the third decimal (i.e. 0.0011-0.0015 down; 0.0016-0.0019 up). In case of equality, the higher mark from the Compulsory Test from the first round will decide.

The best 15 placed vaulters of the first round may start in the second round.

IV./2. The FEI World Vaulting Championship

2.1. TEAM Vaulting Competitions for teams-2* (Art.715; 731 - 743)

No age limit.(Art. 715)

A vaulting **senior team** consists of one longeur, one horse, and six vaulters and may include one alternate vaulter. (Art.731;733;734;741)

The competition will be held over three tests in two rounds. The first round consists of compulsory and free test. The final (second) round consists of only free test. Final score see Art.742

The best 12 senior teams of the first round are allowed to start in the final (second) round. (Art.743)

2.2. Female Individual Vaulting Competition for Seniors **(Art .715;744,745; 746; 747,753)**

Female senior individual: 14 and older

The competition consists of two rounds of four tests, in the first round compulsory and free test in second round technical test and free test must be performed. Final score see by Art.753

Female senior individual vaulters may take part in competition from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 14. There is no upper age limit. (Art 715)

The best 15 placed vaulters of the first round may start in the second round.

2.3. Male Individual Vaulting Competition for Seniors **(Art .715;744,745; 746; 747,753)**

Male senior individual: 14 and older

The competition consists of two rounds of four tests, in the first round compulsory and free test in second round technical test and free test must be performed. Final score see by Art.753

Male senior individual vaulters may take part in competition from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 14. There is no upper age limit. (Art 715)

The best 15 placed vaulters of the first round may start in the second round.

IMPORTANT WARNING: vaulters, who participate in FEI CH-M-V can not participate in FEI CH-EU-J-V!!!

Qualification Requirements:

Vaulters may participate in **either** the 2008 CH-EU-J-V Open **or** the 2008 CH-M-V.
(Reference: Article 124.6 FEI General Regulations).

Junior Individual European Championships 2008

Individual Junior vaulters must have attained an average score of 5.5 points or higher in Round I (comprising Compulsory and Freestyle Tests) at one CVI 1* provided the horse canters left or at one CVI 2*. These scores must have been attained between January 1st 2007 and the closing date for Nominated Entries.

There are no qualification requirements for Teams.

World Championships 2008

Individual vaulters who are members of NFs in Group I & Group II must have attained an average score of 6.0 points or higher in Round 1 (comprising Compulsory and Freestyle Tests) in at least two CVI 2*.

All other Individual vaulters must have attained an average score of 6.0 points or higher in Round I (comprising Compulsory and Freestyle Tests) at one CVI 2*/1* provided the

horse canters left. These scores must have been attained between January 1st 2007 and the closing date for Nominated Entries.

There are no qualification requirements for Teams.

Important:

Horses may compete in both Championships but only in accordance with Article 716.4 of the FEI Rules for Vaulting Events.

V. INVITATIONS (Art. 120; 703; 704; 705; 707;710, 711)

The Organising Committee of FEI Junior Open European Vaulting Championships, FEI World Vaulting Championships and the Czech republic Equestrian Federation invites all nations registered with the FEI.

1. Number of vaulters per NF on FEI J-EU-CH-V + FEI W-CH-V:

Each National Federation can enter to FEI CH-EU-J-V:

One junior team-1*, each consisting of six vaulters, one reserve vaulter, one longeur, one horse. One reserve longeur and one reserve horse for the team may be entered.

Three junior female individual vaulters; plus one reserve female individual vaulter; for each individual vaulter one horse and one longeur may be entered.

Three junior male individual vaulters; plus one reserve male individual vaulter; for each individual vaulter one horse and one longeur may be entered.

Each National Federation can enter to FEI W-CH-V:

One senior team-2*, each consisting of six vaulters, one reserve vaulter, one longeur, one horse. One reserve longeur and one reserve horse for the team may be entered.

Three senior female individual vaulters; plus one reserve female individual vaulter; for each individual vaulter one horse and one longeur may be entered.

Three senior male individual vaulters; plus one reserve male individual vaulter; for each individual vaulter one horse and one longeur may be entered.

The Accreditation Process of Participants

The organization of a major equestrian event, such as Open J-EU-CH-V and W-CH-V Brno 2008 competition necessitates strict access control to all official competition and training venues, zones and areas. As far as possible the OC provides a contingency in the parking area for those who are looking for being accommodated in their own trucks, lorries or caravans. This parking area is closed and guarded 24 hours a day during the entire duration of the event.

Power supply for trucks, lorries, caravans will be provided for a fee of **EUR 50 for the duration:** from Sunday 27th July, 2008, to Monday, 4th August, 2008.

3. HORSES (Art. 725.2.2) FEI Open J-EU-CH-V and FEI W-CH-V competition

All participating vaulting horses must be seven or older.

All transportation and travelling expenses – including horses - shall be born by competitors.

The OC FEI Open J-EU-CH-V and FEI W-CH-V Brno 2008 competition will not reimburse any transportation, customs and/or veterinary expenses related to the travelling of participants.

The horses may not be unloaded without the authorisation of the Vet upon arrival at the Gate 9.

Feed and Stabling arrangements

The stables of the FEI Open J-EU-CH-V and FEI W-CH-V Brno 2008 competition will be operational from Sunday 27th July, 2008, 08.00am and must be cleared by Monday, 4th August, 2008 12.00 pm.

Medical and veterinary services as well as the service of a farrier are available during the show at the competitors own expense. Further information is available at the show office.

9. SECURITY

The access to stables is limited to those persons indicated in Vet. Reg. Art.1005.2.5. (see XI. 10.)

The following security provisions are made for OPEN J-EU-CH-V and W-CH-V:

Venue Security: There will be a high level of security provided to the venue which includes physical perimeter security, security patrolling and random security screening of all pedestrians, vehicles and material that enter the venue.

Access Control: Unauthorised access to restricted or sensitive spaces will not be allowed: all access controls shall be strictly enforced. Restricted or sensitive spaces will be determined by the Event Director and Competition Director.

Isolation and Quarantine Spaces: Security will support the control of isolation and quarantine spaces within the venues.

Closing Times of Stables

Stables will be closed every night between 22.00 and 06.00 hours. During these times, entry will only be possible in cases of emergency, and only when accompanied by the stable steward in charge.

Emergency telephone numbers of the team manager or head groom should be clearly readable and visible on the front of the door of each stable.

Safety

Evacuation will occur only in event of a security or public safety incident that threatens the general safety of those present at the location: whether athletes, officials, spectators, staff, grooms or horses.

If an incident occurs which could cause immediate, imminent, or critical threat to life or property (including fire), an evacuation will be made as stipulated in the OC Venue Emergency Response Plan (VERP).

The following safety regulations must be obeyed:

- **Smoking is strictly prohibited in the entire stable, grooming and storage areas.**
- **Open fires (e.g. camping stoves) are strictly prohibited.**
- **Only food supplies that are actually needed may be stored in the stables.**
- **Evacuation routes, pathways and open spaces between the stables must be clear from all obstructions.**
- **It is strictly prohibited that grooms remain with their horses during the night.**
- **Dogs are strictly prohibited on the entire show grounds!!!**

All the above security and safety precautions will be strictly enforced.

Cars, motorised carriages, motorbikes, **are not** allowed on the entire show grounds.

The Chef d'Equipe must ensure that his/her grooms, or any other authorised persons with access to his/her horses, are familiar with the security and stewarding procedures operating at the Open J-EU-CH-V and W-CH-V Brno 2008.

10. CONTROL OF STABLE ACCESS

Access Control System will operate at all entrance gates of all stables to provide an efficient and reliable method of identifying those who enter and leave the stable area at any time. Extra vigilance will be used in establishing the identification of persons and the reason of entering the stables during the day or night.

11. STEWARDING OF STABLE AREA

At least one stable steward /stable manager directly responsible to the Chief Steward will be present and available in the vicinity of the stable area 24 hours a day during the entire duration of the event. He/she may be assisted by deputies as required. This steward will regularly patrol the stable area, without establishing any predetermined pattern, to discourage any form of illegal practices or abuses to horses. Any misdemeanours will be reported immediately to the Chief Steward.

12. MOVEMENT THROUGHOUT EVENT GROUND

Movement of horses between the stables, open-air warming up arena, practice arena and riding hall and grazing area and main area will be strictly controlled. Horses need to wear their start numbers at all times outside of their respective stables and must be walked in hand.

The layout and flow of movements are visible on attached map. Horses must be walked in hand within this area

DOGS, CATS, OTHER PETS ARE STRICTLY PROHIBITED ON THE ENTIRE SHOW GROUNDS, STABLES AND THE HOTEL, INCL. THE RESTAURANT, PARKING PLACE!

We kindly ask you to leave them at home.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. **The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.**

VETERINARY MATTERS (Art. 1004.2, 1005, 1011)

1. VETERINARY ASPECTS "A"

VETERINARY REGULATIONS, 10th Edition, 1st January 2006

VETERINARY EXAMINATIONS, HORSE INSPECTIONS & PASSPORT CONTROLS

These will be carried out in accordance with the "Veterinary Regulations", Art. 1011 & the discipline rules.

"General Regulations", 21st Edition, effective 1st January 2005 will apply:

Art. 139.1

Every horse entered for any competition at CNs or CIMs (see Appendix D) in a foreign country (see GRs 141.2), and all horses entered for other CIs, CIOs, Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, whether at home or in foreign countries (see GRs 141.2), must have an official, valid FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI and accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card and, when applicable, an FEI registration number, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

Art. 139.2

Horses taking part in CNs and CIMs (see Appendix D) in their country of residence are not required to have such a passport as is mentioned in paragraph 1. All such horses must be properly registered and identifiable and, unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION, VET. REGS. ANNEX VII (except events taking place in NZL & AUS)

INFECTIO ANEMIA – laboratory examination with negativ result, not older than 24 months!!!

All horses and ponies for which an FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI has been issued, must have the vaccination section endorsed by a veterinarian, stating that it has received two injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza, given between 1 and 3 months apart. In addition, a booster injection must be recorded as having been given within each succeeding 6 months, subsequent to the second injection of the primary vaccination. None of these injections must have been given within the preceding 7 days including the day of the competition or of entry into the competition stables.

The above are the minimum requirements for influenza vaccination. Both primary and first and subsequent booster injections should be given according to the manufacturer's instructions which will fall within the stipulation of the FEI ruling.

SAMPLING FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES (Vet. Regs. Chapter V & VI and Annex IV)

Regular sampling is carried out in CCI3*/4*, CSIs (3*, 4*, 5*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CIs sampling is recommended. When testing takes place, the number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate; however, a minimum of three is recommended (Vet. Regs. Art. 1016)

Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme (Groups I & II only).

MEDICATION CONTROL PROGRAMME (GROUP I & II ONLY)

The Organising Committees of FEI events within Groups I & II are advised to charge competitors the equivalent of CHF 12.50 per horse per event as a contribution towards the costs of the MCP programme.

2. VETERINARY ASPECTS "B"

A.) HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ENTRY OF HORSES

At the time of the horse examination, i.e. on arrival of the horses on the show venue and before entering stables, every chef d'équipe (or competitor) is obliged to have on hand the health certificates which are required for the transport to the event.

If the horse comes **from an EU member country**, a health certificate for registered equidae according to the specimen of Annex B of the Directive 90/426 EFX in the currently valid issue.

If the horse comes **from a third country**, a health certificate for registered equidae according to the specimen of Annex II of the decision of the Commission 92/260 in the currently valid issue.

Horses, coming from non-EU, must be accompanied by an ATA-Carnet!

A certificate must be done in at least one official language of the country of destination and in one official language of the member country (it will be best English or German,..)

The competitor must carry with him/her the original certificate not a copy!!!

The organiser sees to it that on the competition site, an official state veterinarian is present to issue the health certificate which is necessary for the transport of horses to their destination abroad.

In the case the OC has entrusted to a forwarding agency, the latter is ready to assist regarding the required documents. Besides, questions relating to health requirements for horses can be directed to the veterinary in the country of origin.

B.) CUSTOMS FORMALITIES

NFs holding an international event in their country should inform their National Veterinary Authority and their Customs Authority at least four weeks beforehand. They should request every facility to assist the movement of horses accompanied by FEI Passports, and the necessary veterinary certification at frontier crossing points into and out of their countries. (Vet. Regs. Art. 1004.2)

C.) MCP CENTRAL LABORATORY - APPLICABLE ONLY TO GROUPS I & II

Under the Medication Control Programme (MCP) in **Groups I and II**, all samples collected in accordance with Vet. Regs Art. 1016 will be analysed by the **Laboratoire des Courses Hippiques (LCH), 15, rue de Paradis, F-91370 Verrières le Buisson.** The central MCP Laboratory will be reviewed in June 2009. Please refer to FEI Bulletin for further information. For events other than those listed in Vet. Regs Art. 1016 or for events other than in Groups I and II, samples may be analysed at an alternative FEI listed laboratory (Vet Regs Art. 1021).

XI. MISCELLANEOUS

1. OBJECTIONS/COMPLAINTS (Art. 167-171)

All objections and complaints to be valid must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150.- or equivalent in EUR or CZK.

2. DECLARATION OF STARTERS

The Chef d'Equipe must declare the following by Tuesday 29th July, 2008 12.00am:

- a. the names of the senior and junior individuals, longeurs and horses
- b. the starting order of individual vaulters participating on the same horse
- c. the composition of the senior and junior teams. Name of vaulters, their birth day, names of team (club or country) and longeurs of the horses, horses` names.

The order of go will be determined by a draw at the Technical Meeting on Tuesday 29th July 2008 at 2.00pm.

3. GENERAL CLASSIFICATION AT THE BEGINNING OF THE COMPETITONS – OPENING CEREMONY

The Opening Ceremony will take place in Hall V. On 29th July 2008 at 6.pm. The traditional "Parade of Nations" will be included in the programme.

All competitors as well as official team members who are already in Brno at the time of the Opening Ceremony are asked to join the parade. This applies to the NF's off, Teams, President, and General Secretary of your Federation if they would like to join your team. It will take place on foot. The opening ceremony is without horses. The OC Brno asks you to wear official team suite for receptions or a more informal outfit (e.g.national colour, or a polo shirt). The OC Brno will publish the meeting point and more info about it upon arrival.

For better planning of the Opening Ceremony, OC Brno would like to check number of the team members, which OC can expect for Nations Parade. Therefore the OC Brno kindly asks for your help making a list and hand over it to show office upon arrival– on Sunday 27th July. The OC are aware that this can only be preliminary information. If you do not know the number of persons exactly, please estimate. This will be a help for futher planning to manage this event for visitors and competitors.

4. GENERAL CLASSIFICATION AT THE END OF THE COMPETITONS CLOSING CEREMONY – PRIZE GIVING CEREMONY on OPEN J-EU-CH-V and W-CH-V

All the competitors will participate in the closing ceremony dressed as for the competition or in their national colour.

The medal ceremony will take place in Hall V on Saturday 2nd August for FEI OPEN J-EU-CH-V and on Sunday 3rd August at 06.30 pm for FEI W-CH-V.

After the final test of each category will take place medal ceremony only for the 1st and the 2nd and 3rd placed competitors or teams.

It will be with horses and loungers.

The prize giving ceremony will be continue in the evening at the party.

Closing ceremony will be continue for all competitors FEI OPEN J-EU-CH-V, FEI W-CH-V on Sunday, 3rd August.

Prizes:

The 1st and the 2nd and 3rd placed vaulters and loungers of each competition will get a trophy, medal, all participating horses will get stable plaques and rosettes, all vaulters and lungers will get rosettes and souvenirs.

5. PRIZE - CLASSIFICATION (Art. 128; 129; 130;725;743.2 , 742.1)

Vaulting teams:

The marks for both rounds are added and divided by two. In case of equality of the total marks, the higher mark of the total score of the first round will decide. If still equal, the higher mark of the compulsory score in the first round will decide.

Individuals:

The marks for both rounds are added and divided by two. In case of equality of the total marks, the higher mark of the total compulsory score in first round will decide. If still equal, the higher mark of the technical test in the final (second) round will decide.

6. MEDICAL SERVICES and MEDICAL INSURANCES

A first aid and emergency first response medical service will be provided during the competition to any person requiring medical assistance. This service will operate in official competition and training locations during official operating hours. This service will comprise a dedicated medical team, supported by an ambulance service.

In the event patients require more specialised medical care they will be transported to the City Hospital, where medical treatment will be provided for the expense of the individual.

It is essential that all participants possesses a valid health insurance policy which covers the costs may occur. Athletes are also obliged to carry a health certificate which proves they are fit to compete. The provision of these documents is the sole responsibility of all participants. The OC declines any liability for any cost related to medical care outside the scope of the provided service.

7. VETERINARY AND FARRIER SERVICES

Veterinary assistance, as well as farrier services will be available during the whole events at the own expense of the participants.

The Organising Committee-Brno will not intervene in those settlements!

8. INSURANCE

All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full

coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

The OC will NOT be responsible for any damage caused by competitors, their horses, owners, longeurs, NF officials, their employees / grooms,

contractors or their representatives.

Would a competitor's insurance fail to provide proper compensation, the organiser's civil liability insurance should in no case be applied.

Further competitor's horses and personal equipment are at their own responsibility throughout the event. They must also cover the repatriation costs in case of any accident. Consequently, participants waive all claims they could enact against the organiser.

9. LIABILITY

The OC declines any liability for property or pecuniary damage which may happen to visitors, competitors, grooms, horses and horse owners through slight negligence of OC, its delegates or its assistants.

OC also declines any liability for damage to vehicles, tack and other equipments as a result of any cause whatsoever, including theft, fire or other damages, incidents.

Accordingly, the participants renounce any and all rights if recourse against the organisers.

In cases not properly covered, no claims could be made against the Organising Committee- Brno liability insurance.

9. EVENT'S ORGANISATION (Art. 114 - 115)

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of Chefs d'Equipe and Ground Jury the Organising Committee Brno reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matter or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all competitors and officials as soon as possible and they must be reported to the FEI Secretary General by the Foreign Judge.

10. STABLE INSPECTION (Art.1005.2.5.2 of the Vet.Reg.)

The only personnel authorised by the Organising Committee Brno to enter the stable area are:

- Stewards who works for stable security
- FEI Vet
- Team Vet
- Chef d'Equipe
- 4 accreditations with stable access per horse (to include groom, owner, lounge, vaulter etc.)
- National Trainer

In addition, and with the approval of the President of the OC, Presidents and Secretary General of NFs may also the visit the stable area.

Accredited journalists accompanied by an official appointed by the OC may also in limited time visit the stable.

Competitors may arrive ONLY between the following hours to Gate 9:

Sunday 27th 8h – 22h

Monday 28th up to 8h

No horses will be admitted without having been seen by the Show Vets.

Stables will be closed on Monday 4th August at 12.00am.

11. ENTRY RIGHT TO SHOWGROUNDS (Art. 133; 1005)

Chef d'Equipe, longeurs, attendants, grooms, vaulters, horse owners are allowed to enter the practice arena (warming up arena) and competitors stands.

MIXED ZONE AND MEDIA INTERVIEWS

Mixed Zones are restricted areas where vaulters are required to pass located off the competition area. They provide the media with the opportunity to meet vaulters, trainers, longeurs, or quick and informal interviews on their performance. Competitors should go through the Mixed Zone after their competition.

Vaulters are not obliged to stop and talk to the media. However they should be aware that there are few opportunities for the media to meet vaulters, trainers, longeurs, except in the Mixed Zone or at Press / Media Centre. Competitors should attend press conferences and media interviews when requested.

NO GO ZONE

The purpose of this policy is to ensure that media representatives, photographers and cameramen respect certain areas in the competition area, warm up areas and veterinary check areas where they are not permitted. The limits of the area known as the NO GO ZONE will be clearly marked. All media representatives are required to observe these restricted spaces. The size of this zone will be decided by OC, depending on the venue.
